

Resolution Security Act

Be it resolved by the senate and house of representatives of the republic of Texas, in congress assembled.

Joint resolution proposed by the senate of the thirteenth congress
of the republic of Texas

After the people's congressional senate and house of representatives for the republic of Texas, in a meeting of congress assembled under rules of necessity the following resolution was approved and adopted.

Resolution No 0209-9003 originating from the senate
and house resolution No. 14-03-14-2009

Sec.1. Whereas, it being necessary to have the most efficient and effective communications and direct supervision possible by the President and congress concerning all republic of Texas defence forces for the protection of its Texian people and all lands, airspace, and waterways within the republic of Texas geographical boundaries...

Be it resolved by the senate and house of representatives of the republic of Texas, in congress assembled in compliance with Article II of the 1836 Constitution, there shall be chosen three senate and two house members to act as Security Council in partnership with the President being the Commander-in-Chief coordinating all defence ground, air and water armed forces, with the reporting Major-General in charge over the individual officers commanding the Army, Navy, Army Air Defence, Texas Border Guard, Texas Coast Guard and the Texian Rangers.

Sec. 2. Be it resolved, the **Security Council** members shall be chosen from each body respectively sitting in quorum.

Sec. 3. Be it resolved the Declaration of Rights shall be maintained with honor at any time defence emergencies have been declared and defence forces are in an active state.

Sec. 4. Be it resolved the Commander-in-Chief shall report to said Security Council on the state of the military concerning its defence of the republic of Texas on a scheduled regular basis or as circumstances require.

Sec. 5. Be it resolved all National Defence Security briefings shall be closed. Anybody disclosing information from the Security Council, except for information the Commander-in-Chief deems necessary to release when addressing congress, shall immediately be impeached and tried.

Sec. 6. Be it resolved the Commander-in-Chief may present to the Senate President for the senate body or the speaker of the house a written request to replace a Security Council member due to illness, death, non-attendance, or for some other factual reasons deemed necessary as determined by the Security Council.

Sec.7. Be it further resolved, that this resolution takes effect from and after its passage.
