The Speaker of the House spoke on the status of certain Bills both house are trying to intact. Re: Granting Pardons and Remissions

Under the authority delegated by Article VI, [Presidential Qualifications, Powers, and the Franchise] Sec. 4 of the 1836 Constitution of the Republic of Texas, the president ... "shall have power to remit fines and forfeitures, and to grant re- pries and pardons".

It is my pleasure to inform you that I have written Pardons in the names of: Coolidge Gerdes, Jack Grebe, John Hamilton, Johnie Wise, Vin- cent Dale Ross and Leonard Hughes. I also Remitted any: forfeitures, fines, debts or claims, within the outer borders of this Texas republic.

It is a failure of faith in our nation's future that would cause a man to declare I wasted my time writing such documents, because the de facto powers will not yield to your lawful authority. For those who once believed our future is as certain as the law of our land, then believe that the day will come when the powers vested in the president for granting pardons and remissions will be brought into the forefront and the enforce- ment will follow, causing glorious changes. I ask you this: "did you previously undertake to support the republic of Texas because we were in control of Texas, or because you believe that is what we will achieve, in time, using our labor"? If you once believed, continue to believe; for the times they "are a changing".

We will win, I used the pen (mightier than the sword) to fight injustice, and because truth and rights are powerful weapons, in time, they al- ways come out on top of the problems.

There is an instilled reason for reacting instead of acting. I, like most, have spent a great part of my life being instructed by people I didn't know and told do things I had no desire to do. As offensive as that can become, being punished for not complying with those rules felt worst. It didn't matter that I did not harm a single living soul or their property; comply or else feel the force and weight of their strength and ability (absent our law and rights). Reacting is instinctive and reasonable, but building and acting upon a foundation and plan for redemption is supe- rior.

Our foundation is there, but hidden beneath a lot of fictions and "color of" frauds. The 1836 republic of Texas Constitution is a much better source to build upon than on private hopes and dreams that you and only a few others share (I am not placing that above our service to the one true God and father of all). It is not because your hopes and dreams are not valuable, it is because the time you spend building in the slime pits of their fraudulent system will deprive you of a reliable foundation and so denying you reasonable security for your hard earned valuables. Those who intend to tackle the present day problems in Texas, created by the de facto foreign forces against the peace and dignity of the re- public of Texas, with the superimposed and so-called constitution(s) of the State of Texas and of the United States of America, are not trust- ing the most basic and necessary weapon for the success of our nation and freedom. That weapon is "truth", and the adage "The pen is might- ier than the sword" is not to be overlooked. Who would waste their time writing about their rights and undertake uncompensated efforts to change the status quo, or implore others to join in the cause if they didn't have a deep-seated belief that words can make an impact against the things that affect Texians negatively? Moreover, you end up focusing on the failings of diversity instead of the strength of common goals, and the product will probably resemble a rebuilt fraud.

If you want a new name for the old breach of peace upon our land, I do not share your desire. The more goals we have in common, the greater our strength and the fewer our falling-outs. I recall and believe that biblical truth: "a house divided can not stand".

We have the building blocks: people, lands, water, air, rights, and truth, with a constitution that is known and historically recognized as lawful and treaties with other nations. I believe all of us should know and support the goals, know or learn our limits, do our duty and not waiver. We must take time when we would enjoy doing something else. No plan works when the workers do not participate.

Contact the republic of Texas and begin doing your part. Start acting and your foes will begin to react more than act. Every act that brought victory began with one determined soul who then won the support of another, etc., and you know why that must be. Remember, "Put up or shut up". I am wearied by "do nothing" complainers, because losers quit, but the victors wouldn't.

The following is part of the official minutes assigning the Senate Districts to be up for election . The Senate districts that need filling are vacant at present.

1836 Constitution Article 1; Sec. 9. At the first session of congress after the adoption of this constitution, the senators shall be divided into three classes, as nearly equal as practicable; the seats of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the end of the first year; of the second class, at the end of the second year; the third class, at the end of the third year, in such a manner that one-third shall be chosen each year thereafter. The Senate was divided into classes as follows.

Class One: Districts: Two, Seven, Eleven, and Fourteen (Vacant at present)
Class Two: Districts: One, Four, Eight, Nine, and Ten
Class Three: Districts: Three, Five, Six, Twelve, and Thirteen

Attorney General Alva Rice McLeod to write potential UNITED STATES OF AMERICA d.b.a. foreign corpora-present, with his health issues having affected him, I don't cause to be concerned, as I can and will do it if necessary.

I am certain someone will think Rice or I will be writing law, but that is a far cry from fact. It is the duty of the executive branch to provide protection for the nation against foreign corporations doing business without authority from the Texas government. It is also the duty of the executive branch through the department leaders who are cabinet members to enforce the laws of the nation against foreign corporations illegally doing business in Texas, with or without a corporate charter. If that could not be done, foreign corporations could enter Texas and conduct all the business they wanted and never be held accountable to the laws of the land when they have no charter. On its face that is unthinkable and unacceptable. How can you tax them if they are without accountability to the national government?

Ask yourself: would you want or request a charter to do business outside Texas if you are without accountability or taxes as long as you don't have a charter? Neither would a de facto power ask our government for a charter. If an unchartered corporation on the land of Texas injures a citizen, does the Attorney General have the authority to represent that foreign corporation when the corporation has no charter or representative listed in the public records to speak to about the damages? You bet your boots, he must and he does. If the attorney for the foreign corporation can write a proposed charter for the congress to grant and our Attorney General is now, in fact, its representative by its own failings to acknowledge our laws, can he write a charter for our Congress to consider and grant? You know the answer. Is the Attorney General a Cabinet member and supposed to do things at my discretion? You know the answer. If I can instruct the Attorney General to do this, do I have the authority to do this? You know the answer is, yes. The last question about writing law is: If the attorney for the foreign corporation writes a proposed charter and requests its approval, did the attorney write law? If you answer yes, then you are saying a foreign agent can write laws for the republic and I object to that as being untrue. If you say no, then you cannot justly say the Attorney General or I am writing law. The issue is dead with simple logic!

It is in the authority of the Congress to Grant charters (A broad application from: Article II. [Congressional Powers] Sec. 3... "to grant charters of incorporation, patents, and copyrights, and secure to the authors and inventors the exclusive use thereof for a limited time"). Of course such power is to be used for the benefit of people. If it is their authority to grant, then the door is open to all forms of requests. This is a big subject I will not try to complete it at the present.

I can not place all the Charter responsibility on the shoulders of our Attorney General, as the Congress must bear the blunt of the responsibility, and I also share some, as I will review the Attorney General's Charter Documents and the position offered to Congress by the Executive branch must be comfortable to the needs of our country. It will be done with caution (soon I hope).

The likely big question from many is: Why seek for the Congress to grant them a charter? Because, there are many businesses operating in the republic of Texas under the de facto rules of their "Charters" issued by the so-called STATE OF TEXAS and UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. How shall these businesses operate in conformity with the de jure laws of the republic if they have no directions to follow? All of them need guidelines to follow in the country in which they operate. To shut-down the so-called STATE OF TEXAS and UNITED STATES OF AMERICA in our venue and jurisdiction leaves us without an established "transmitting utility" with those corporations during the interim phase of the transition of powers. We do not have enough information to contact or meet the needs of those businesses, and most of the information related to those corporations would be buried in the suddenly defunct de facto system archives, leaving a lot of room (way too much) for confusion in our restructuring of the nation. Please, resist any idea supporting that very poor way to regulate the foreign commerce and trade in Texas.

There is also a need to collect taxes from those foreigners that are profiting within our country. No, that does not mean that our citizens must stand their ground in each business demanding a card to relieve them of unlawful taxation. It is the business that is to be taxed, not the people. Yes, directly or indirectly only people can pay taxes, but it would not be a direct taxation collected by the foreign corporations, as now occurs. Understanding taxes is something all people must do if they are to know the truth about them. It is impossible for governments to function completely constitutionally without taxes. Those who expect our government to be effective and do their job without financing through taxes are in serious need of mental assistance. Our nation's future demands monies to function. There are also minerals being taken from our ground without compensation to our nation that must be collected. We also suffer from politicians structuring corporate rules so that down the road many costs that should be on the business side or private side, become socialized (a future problem to consider).

Tell your friends that some taxes are needed and not all are oppressive. Maybe they will ask you about those issues. It has been sounded out often, by some members of Congress, that we collect taxes (1% is the common number I heard) at the borders and ports to finance Texas. We must be cautious and people must be able to pay their bills and take care of their private needs. Is that 1% limit a good deal for Texas, sending our oil and gas out of Texas at a very low tax rate? I have some reservations on the subject of oil and gas exports. A workman is worthy of the fruits of his labor. Let's protect and help develop our nation's economy.
